

**Problem:** Recent studies show that <u>72% of</u> <u>people</u> in the U.S. experience gastrointestinal (GI) symptoms more than a few times per month, but only <u>1 in 4 are diagnosed</u>.



Over 700 related ICD-10 codes, which means digestive disease is likely to be a top five condition for most employers when looking at medical and pharmacy costs

- 40% of U.S. population claim their daily lives are disrupted by GI issues – with <u>13 missed work</u> days for IBS and 17 for IBD
- More people in U.S. are hospitalized with digestive disease than any other condition
- Digestive disease was the <u>second-most</u> <u>common type of short-term disability claim</u> in 2020



Value: Treating members with digestive health conditions can reduce overall population healthcare costs for employers. It can also improve employee health, longevity, productivity, and engagement.

## Employers are increasingly focused on digestive health

- 15% of employers took action in 2023



# GI conditions affect <u>1 in 4 and are costing you more than heart</u> <u>disease and mental health</u>

Digestive conditions are inherently complex, with hundreds of GI conditions, marked by overlaying conditions, complicated comorbidities, and interdependent mental health conditions. Symptoms usually begin at a young age and disproportionately affect females. While proven interventions exist, they are not widely available or reimbursed — driving costly escalations within the system.

# Undiagnosed conditions affect approximately 100,000,000 Americans



- Condition overlays and comorbidities frequently lead to no diagnosis
- Misdiagnosis common due to limited definitive testing
- Diagnosis of exclusion requires years of testing without assurance
- Many give up due to frustration with getting diagnosis



#### Avoidable cost drivers

- Expensive medications, such as biologics and IBS medications
- Procedures (e.g., endoscopies) and surgeries
- Imaging and testing
- Uncontrolled symptoms drive high ER utilization

During the diagnostic journey and while finding the right treatment, your employees are struggling, missing work, and relying on urgent care and emergent options to treat flares. In GI, patients — your employees — are driving the utilization within the system because they are acutely feeling their symptoms every day. This leads to prolonged suffering and cost which is largely avoidable.

The typical diagnostic journey is <u>2-3 years</u> long




